Make a crown

You could make a crown and pretend to be the queen or king – or you can take it off and tell Jesus he is your king.

You will need:

- Card - enough to cut into strips to fit around your head. An old cereal box would work if you don't have supplies of craft card.
- Scissors
- A stapler
- Pens
- Glue
- Decorations – sequins, feathers or stickers if you have them, or you could cut little squares of foil or coloured paper to stick on.

First, cut strips of card the right height for your crown. Ask a grown-up to measure how many strips will fit around your head and staple them together into a long line.

Before you make your crown into a ring, cut the top into any shape you want such as waves or zig zags. If you want to draw or write anything on your crown (such as "Jesus is my king"), do it now.

Now ask a grown-up to measure the crown on your head again, and staple the ends together into a ring of just the right size for you.

Lastly, use your decorations and glue to make your crown look really special! For an extra challenge you could try to make a big cross that sticks up from your crown, like Queen Elizabeth II has.
