**A Bible story**

We read the story of Jesus coming into Jerusalem on a donkey as God's rescuing king. If we let Jesus be our king, he rescues us from our sins and we can live forever with him. We can be very happy about this! Can you remember the signs for King and Rescue?

*They brought the donkey to Jesus and put their coats on it, and Jesus sat on it. Many people spread their coats on the road. Others cut branches in the fields and spread the branches on the road. Some of the people were walking ahead of Jesus. Others were following him. All of them were shouting,*

*"Praise God! God bless the One who comes in the name of the Lord! God bless the kingdom of our father David! That kingdom is coming! Praise to God in heaven!"*

*(Mark 11:7-10, New Century Version Bible)*

- We could colour a picture of rescuers (below)

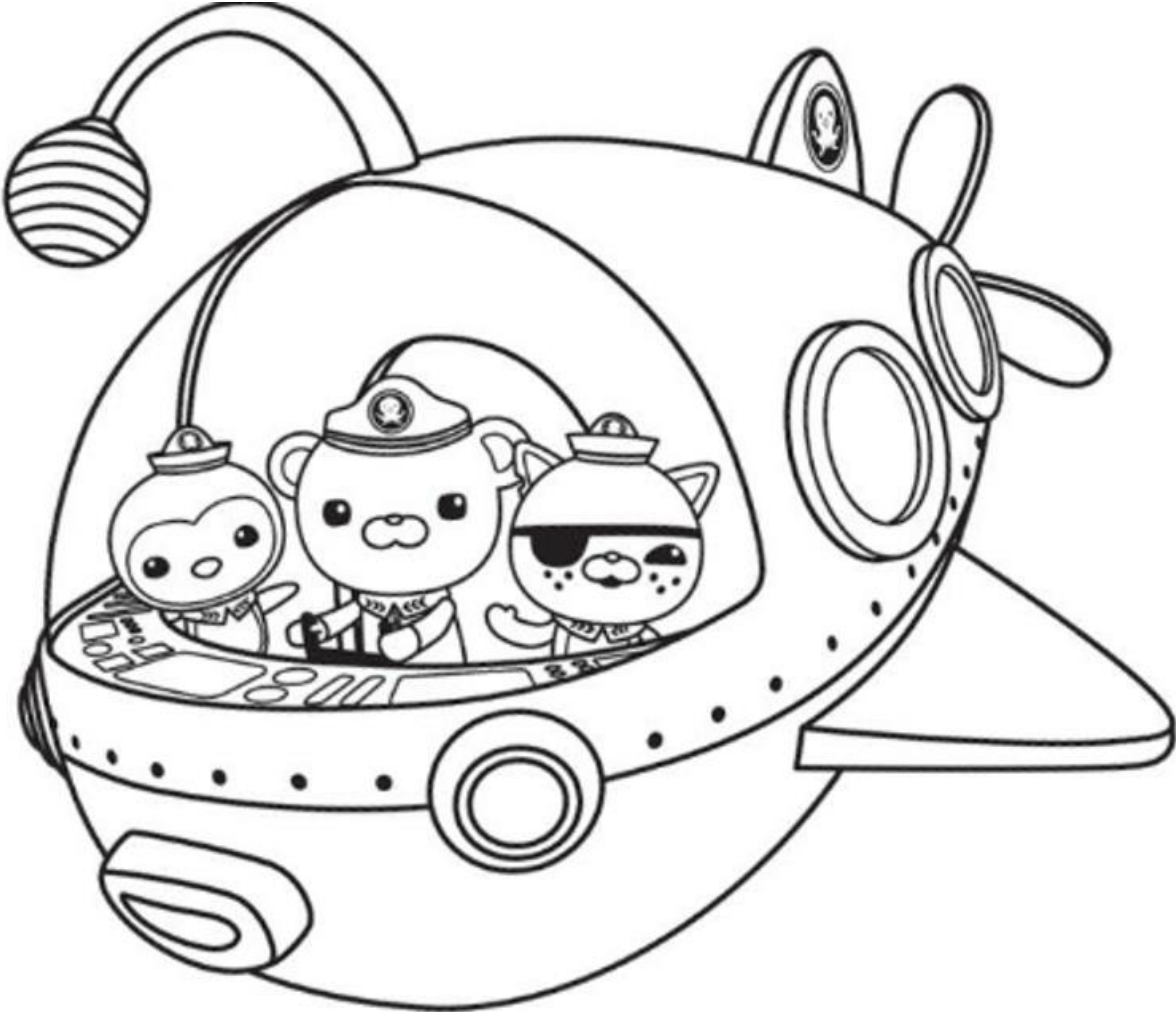
Why don't you try some of these at home? Or maybe you have an idea that you could do?
